

Definitions of Country of Origin

South American Origin

This material is sourced from a specific country in the sub-continent of South America, for example Argentina, Brazil, Uruguay, Paraguay, Venezuela, Columbia, Bolivia and Chile. This material is collected and processed in facilities registered and inspected by the competent veterinary authority in the country of origin.

USDA Grade Origin (“Approved”)

This material is sourced in countries approved for import into the United States by the USDA. Currently this includes Central America, Canada, Australia and New Zealand and Chile. This material is collected and processed in facilities registered and inspected by the competent veterinary authority in the country of origin. In many instances the material cannot be distributed within the USA without successfully passing safety testing in USDA laboratories.

EU Grade Origin (“Approved”)

This material is sourced in countries approved for import into the European Union by the European Commission. Currently this includes Central and South America, USA, Canada, Australia and New Zealand and South Africa. This material is collected and processed in facilities registered and inspected by the competent veterinary authority in the country of origin.

EU Origin

This material is sourced from EU registered facilities inside the European Union

USA Origin

This material sourced from USDA registered facilities in the United States of America.

Australian Origin

This is material sourced from AQIS registered facilities in Australia.

New Zealand Origin

This is material sourced from NZFSA registered facilities in New Zealand

Canadian Origin

This is serum sourced from CFIA registered facilities in Canada

Mexican Origin

This is serum sourced from locally approved facilities in Mexico

Central American and Caribbean Origin

This is serum sourced from locally approved facilities in Panama, Costa Rica, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Honduras, Guatemala, Belize, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Haiti and /or Jamaica
